## **POLICY ON TRANSFER & LIFE EXPERIENCE CREDITS**

### **Transfer Credits**

Upon evaluation by the Associate Dean for Student Affairs, credits earned in other Christian Universities and Bible Colleges, and certain secular colleges and universities may be transferred to Dominion Leadership University. Students should request their former school to send an official copy of their transcripts to the Associate Dean for Student Affairs. An evaluation report will be provided to the student indicating what courses transferred, as well as their DLU equivalences.

### **Experience Credits**

Transfer students who have been engaged in ministry work may earn 3- 9 credits depending on their position and duration of Christian service. To earn the credits students should present a portfolio which includes:

- i. A list of all schools attended, and the courses studied in each.
- ii. An essay discussing the area of ministry in which they have been serving. Such an essay should include a description of the specific duties they have been undertaking, for how long, etc.
- iii. At least two recommendations, one of which must be from their immediate supervisor/s or head of ministry.
- iv. Copies of documents that prove their educational or experiential qualifications
